



The Signs from Noah's World

Luke 17:26-30

I. The Age of Noah was an Age of Material Abundance and Spiritual Poverty.

(Gen. 6:1-5)

A. Jesus said: “They ate, they drank”: speaks of a time of plenty.

B. Men’s conditions materially seem good for all.

C. Spiritually: They turned their backs on God.

My Spirit shall not strive with man forever, for he is indeed flesh.

(Gen. 6:3)

Jude 14-15

Now Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied about these men also, saying, "Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of His saints,

¹⁵to execute judgment on all, to convict all who are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have committed in an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things which ungodly sinners have spoken against Him."

Genesis 6:5,

...the wickedness of man was great in the earth and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.

II. Noah's & Lot's Worlds – Worlds of Immorality.

(Lk. 17:26-27 & Gen. 6:2)

A. The most sacred of relationships is marriage.

B. The adopting of old and sinful ways today.

1 Cor.6:9-10; Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor sodomites,

¹⁰nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God.

III. Noah's Age was an Age of Violence.

(Gen. 6:11-13)

A. This past century was a century of violence.

And Jerusalem will be trampled by Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled. (Luke 21:24b)
